## Product

#### **Product description:**

Prefabricated roof trusses made of wood with nail plates are produced by cutting purchased planer stock and assembling it with pressed-in steel nail plates.

The roof trusses are produced with advanced calculation programs and machines.

#### **Product specification**

Construction timber made of spruce with quality C30 has a density of 470 kg/m3 at 17% moisture. Roof trusses are produced in accordance with NS-EN 14250 and are subject to production control to meet the statutory requirement for CE marking.


