

Product

Product description:

The element is designed for covering walls and ceilings in indoors and outdoors spaces with a standard climate. It features battens of MDF with at non-woven fabric and linear ribs attached to the battens. The surface is treated with either oil, lacquer, lacquer fire retardant, or varnish. The ribs are placed on the battens with 40% opening between the ribs.

The ribs have a hardwood core material. In this study oak is used as reference with 21mm thickness, but it can be sold with different types of hardwood and dimensions. The ribs can be surface treated with fire retardant laquer and holds the fireclass B s1,d0.

Batten is made from either standard MDF or fire-impregnated MDF. It is used to hold slot modules together, similar to how battens are mounted on walls. If rib modules are to be installed on the ceiling, the battens will be reinforced. MDF is chosen for its ease of machining grooves that are compatible with our T-profile system. The fire-impregnated MDF is classified as fire-resistant, meeting the B-s1, d0 fire rating.

Between the battens and ribs, a polyester fiber acoustic non-woven fabric is attached for sound absorption. The fabric comes in various thicknesses, and for this study, we are using a 120g/m² fabric with a thickness of 0.55 mm as the reference. The non-woven fabric is fire-retardant and meets the B-s1, d0 fire classification.

The complete product does not hold any fire class itself, only the materials included.

Product specification:

The core material used in the board is MDF batten with hardwood ribs. Oak is used as reference. The non-woven fabric is made of fiber polyester.

The EPD covers all dimensions. The mounting system is not included as multiple options are available.

The EPD is an average EPD as multiple surface treatments are available. A conservative approach is used so that the EPD describes the surface treatment with the highest environmental impact for each category.

The rib board has a density of \geq 10,69 kg/m2 with wood moisture content 14-18 %.

Sweden, Denmark, and Norway. The scenario describes use in Norway.

Reference service life, product:

Reference service life is 50 years. The actual service life depends on maintenance and external impacts.

Reference service life, building:

Reference service life is 50 years. The actual service life depends on climatic conditions and external impacts, such as construction and maintenance.

Additional technical information.

Vyrk AS is not FSC/PEFC certified, but all constituents are purchased from certified providers.

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LCA: Calculation rules

Declared unit:

1 m2 installed rib element board with core material, batten and surface treated, including endof-life handling.

Cut-off criteria:

In accordance with 6.3.5 of the PCR.

Allocation:

Allocation has been made according to EN15804:2012 + A2: 2019 and in accordance with chapter 6.3.5 PCR for wood panels. For the production, energy use, water and waste at fabrication are mass-allocated for the production of different panels and slats.

Ecoinvent v3.8, allocation, cut-off by classification is used as the background database. The database applies economic allocation.

Data quality:

Quantities of all raw materials are measured to the production of 1 m2 of rib element, based on the average consumption at the factory in 2023. The EPDs are used to describe A1-A3 LCA impacts are in the following table. Remaining data are sourced from the Ecoinvent database (v.3.8) using the LCA-software Simapro (v 9.5.0.2). Characterization factors have been used from EN15804:2012 + A2: 2019.


