The products of ductile cast iron is produced in compliance with NS-EN 1563. The products are fully recycable, and doesn't emit gases or contain any damaging elements towards nature. The density of ductile cast iron is around 7000 kg/m³.

Technical data:

In general, a product of ductile cast iron is a 100% recycable, and can always be remelted. The reference service life of street goods is around 4-10 years, depending on traffic load, and over 10 years if there is no traffic load.

Cut-off criteria:

All major raw materials and all the essential energy is included. The production processes for raw materials and energy flows with very small amounts (less than 1%) are not included. These cut-off criteria do not apply for hazardous materials and substances.

Allocation:

The allocation is made in accordance with the provisions of EN 15804. Incoming energy and water and waste production in-house is allocated equally among all products through mass allocation. Effects of primary production of recycled materials is allocated to the main product in which the material was used. The recycling process and transportation of the material is allocated to this analysis.

Data quality:

Specific data for the product composition are provided by the manufacturer. The data represent the production of the declared product and were collected for EPD development in the year of study. Background data is based on EPDs according to EN 15804 and different LCA databases. The data quality of the raw materials in A1 is presented in the table below.



Potential ionizing radiation from the soil, from radon and from some construction materials is also not measured by this indicator.
